1985 BUDGET DAY

You wrote to me on 19 September to confirm that the Prime Minister was content for us to plan on the basis that Budget day next year would be 19 March.

It is customary to announce the date of the Budget in the first Business Statement after the Christmas Recess. The normal form is for an announcement to be made in reply to a question by the Leader of the Opposition who is prompted in advance by the Chief Whip. This year, however, the Chancellor sees some arguments for making the announcement before Christmas, during the Business Statement on 20 December. This would permit those involved in preparations for the asset sales needed to achieve the target for the 1984-85 financial year to make their plans in full knowledge of the date of next year's Budget.


I should be grateful for confirmation that the Prime Minister is content for us to proceed in this way with a 20 December announcement.
