PRIME MINISTERAFTERCARE OF AN ARMY AGENT

see Pt 17.

I wrote to you on 11th September last year about difficulties we were having with the resettlement of one of the Army's agents from Northern Ireland. He had been moved to England at very short notice and given a new life in a town on the South coast; but the security of the operation had been seriously jeopardised when his wife, who was pregnant, insisted on returning to the Republic of Ireland to have her baby.

2. I can now report that all went well. The woman had the baby and has returned to England where she is reunited with her husband. She was not approached by terrorists while in the Republic, and we went to very considerable lengths to ensure that she could not be followed back to her husband. We have no reason to believe that our procedures were in any way compromised. The resettlement of the agent is now proceeding.

3. I am sending copies of this minute to Leon Brittan, Douglas Hurd and Sir Robert Armstrong.
