QUARTERLY REPORT ON DEFENCE SALES AND PROSPECTS

1ST OCTOBER TO 31ST DECEMBER 1984

The last quarter of 1984 saw defence sales worth £448M reported by industry compared with £353M for the previous quarter and £636M for the corresponding quarter of 1983. This figure maintains the trend of my previous report, yielding an annual total value of defence export contracts secured in 1984 of £1562M, a 30% drop from 1983's record achievement.

- The above figures have been compiled on the same basis as 2. previous reports, but a new data collection scheme is being introduced which should reflect more accurately the true value of defence export contracts won by UK industry. We are currently collecting retrospective data on 1984 and I hope to be able to present a revised 1984 total in my next quarterly report. But on the figures available it is apparent, nonetheless, that 1984 was a disappointing year for the UK.
- The largest contracts signed in the final quarter of 1984 were 3. with Algeria for a Gendarmerie Barracks to be supplied by Baxter Fell (£132M), and with Indonesia for two Rapier batteries to be supplied by BAe (£100M). Other significant contracts included Hawk VTX Development for the USA (£63M), a BAe 146 aircraft for Indonesia (£15M) and Sea Skua missiles for Brazil (£15M). Details of all contracts reported in the quarter are given at Annexes A and B, whilst details of the highest priority current sales prospects are listed at Annex C.
- In the middle East there continues to be nervousness over 4. prospects for the price of oil. As you know, a Saudi decision on Tornado and Hawk is still awaited, the Saudis apparently looking at the potential advantages of a deal with ourselves or the French

who have redoubled their efforts to sell Mirage 2000. Encouragingly, the Saudis have agreed to a local trial of Challenger and possibly MCV80 for their armoured brigade requirement of some 120 tanks with supporting equipment, and a detailed commercial proposal has been presented to the Saudi Chief of Staff. The three major Saudi service contracts remain our major toe-hold in the country, and continue to require attention. The air defence project SADAP, due to expire in August 1985, is closely allied to the Tornado/Hawk deal; the National Guard hospital project, SANGMED, should change in May 1985 to see the UK MOD assume only an advisory role. The communications project SANGCOM is coming to the end of its present phase, and is regarded by the Guard as a lower priority than the imminent new contracts for the American and British hospital projects.

- In the remaining Gulf States there have been few developments with the exception of Oman, where a defence sales MOU is about to be concluded which will cover all large defence contracts. The Tornado contract signature is expected within the next few months. Together with an ammunition supply and military communications project to follow, prospects in general look excellent with these three contracts worth around £500M. A decision on MCV 80 is still awaited from Kuwait, where Challenger and Tornado remain longer term prospects. Bahrain has also expressed interest in Challenger and a detailed proposal has been submitted. The Qataris are showing little disposition to take procurement decisions, but in the UAE, following Adam Butler's visit, a report by the Air Defence Advisory Team is being followed up to advance our prospects for the sale of radars and an air operations centre. Following LOA signature in December 1984, and satisfactory financing arrangements, the contract for three frigates for Pakistan is expected at the end of April; I continue to take a close personal interest in this sale. An MOU will be required to cover RN and MOD assistance to the Pakistani Navy during the building and commissioning phases.
- 6. Defence sales to Iran and Iraq remain severely restricted during their conflict, although Iraq is showing renewed interest in establishing

an indigenous aircraft industry based on licensed manufacture of the Hawk. Her economic problems could inhibit early progress which would allow time for the political problems such a sale would pose now, to diminish. Despite your further intervention with King Hussein and my own talks with the Jordanian Commander-in-Chief, the Jordanians decided to buy Soviet missiles rather than Javelin, largely on the grounds of price. However, a definitive list of other equipment has now been received, which they wish to buy against the credit offer made to them last October. The value seems likely to be around £250M. In Syria, the supply of Sea Dart has been refused but authorisation for industry to follow up interest in less controversial equipments has been given while reserving a final decision on supply. Despite considerable activity, Egypt has still not taken up any of the longstanding £300M special credit reservation and we have now told them that we cannot continue to reserve it all much longer. Baxter Fell contract in Algeria was the first to be signed under the Defence Co-operation MOU and several others are expected to follow in 1985. In the rest of Africa there is optimism concerning a possible order for the Westland 30 by Zimbabwe (£30M), and a visit to the UK by the Cameroon Minister of Defence has laid a promising basis for opening up a modest market for UK defence exports to that country.

7. In India it is hoped that negotiations on several major prospects, including Sea Harrier and 155mm guns, can resume following the delays caused by the national elections and the spy scandal. Indeed there are indications that the Sea Harrier contract could be signed before the end of April. Thailand remains interested in ex-RAF Jaguars and ICI Nobel are well placed to win a £30M contract for a propellant plant as are Westlands with the Sea King (£30M), a decision on which is expected by the middle of 1985. Malaysia's decision on a 155mm gun system awaits their next financial plan commencing 1986, whereas Singapore's decisions concerning the RB199 engine and avionics update for Skyhawk aircraft (£150M) and fast patrol craft should be known by Spring 1985. Large additional sales of Rapier to Indonesia are expected to follow the initial £100M order, where the sale of Hawk aircraft, command, communications and intelligence equipment and

surplus RN frigates represent a very substantial long term market. The Korean decision concerning possible Lynx helicopter purchase is expected shortly. Japan's agreement to improve access for military attaches to its Defence Agency should improve our penetration of this difficult market and Lord Young's visit to China in conjunction with forthcoming visits by the Chinese Premier and the Chinese Chief of Air Staff are hoped to have a similar effect on the Chinese market. In Australia, Vickers proposals to supply the T2400 submarine are under consideration and Yarrow's Type 23 frigate design remains in contention for the next generation of RAN vessels. A decision on Westland's helicopter prospects for the RAAF is expected mid year. New Zealand is interested in an avionics update for its Skyhawk aircraft and GEC Avionics appears well placed against American competition.

- In the USA, initial Congressional funding for the Mobile Subscriber Equipment (MSE) Programme, in which Plessey and other UK contractors have an interest of over £1Bn, has finally been approved and a lot now depends on the visit by Congressional VIPs to BAOR in April during deployment of the first Ptarmigan units. Watchman radars are being considered for use by the US Marine Corps and USAF, and the Royal Ordnance 105mm Light Gun is currently under trial. The initial contract for the 81mm mortar was signed in December and represents a significant success after much effort. Our visits to the USA earlier this year, together with those by Adam Butler, John Lee and the Head of Defence Sales, Sir James Blyth, should serve to maintain the momentum on these and other important defence sales prospects in the US. In Canada, the low level air defence requirement, in which both BAe with Rapier and Shorts with Javelin have an interest, will be a subject during Adam Butler's forthcoming visit.
- 9. Activity in Europe during the final quarter of 1984 was slow, but prospects in the short amd medium term look more promising. In particular, the prospect of a sale of Medium Girder Bridging worth £50-£60M to Norway may be successfully concluded during 1985. A Netherlands decision on whether to buy Vertically Launched Sea Wolf



(VLSW) has been deferred until early March 1985. A decision on the Austrian Interceptor aircraft contract is not now expected until May 1985, but Lightning is currently neck and neck with the Swedish Draken. The signature by Senor Narcis Serra and myself of an Exchange of Letters aimed at strengthening UK/Spanish defence equipment co-operation could encourage procurement of UK systems. Prospects also look promising for both British Aerospace and Rolls Royce on the Yugoslav Light Combat Aircraft project, but prospects for selling Tornado to Turkey have receded following our decision not to support the financing arrangements proposed by BAe.

- 10. Latin America remains a particularly difficult market in view of the low credit rating and economic problems affecting most countries in the area. However sales, albeit on a relatively small scale, continue to be achieved. Although no dramatic improvement in the economic situation can be expected in the short term, the opportunity exists for the sale of Lynx helicopters in several markets and developments are expected on this front in Brazil and Ecuador in the next few months. This is likely to give rise to major problems on the credit front.
- 11. As suggested by my previous report, the 1984 achievement was somewhat less significant than the previous record year. This to some extent, however, reflects delays in procurement decisions and there may be some 'unwinding' in 1985. Reports from individual exporters suggest a renewed development of market opportunities in the second half of 1984 which may be transformed into orders in 1985 and beyond. Although general market conditions will remain tough, 1985 could, therefore, show a substantial improvement in UK defence export performance over 1984.
- 12. I am copying this minute to the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry and to Sir Robert Armstrong.
