## VISIT TO THE UNITED KINGDOM BY PRINCE SULTAN

We spoke on the telephone about the arrangements for the visit next week of Prince Sultan. In the nature of things with Saudi Arabia these are likely to remain somewhat fluid but we now have an agreed framework, a copy of which is attached.

You will see that it is now envisaged that on 26th September there will be a meeting between the Defence Secretary and Prince Sultan followed by lunch hosted by the Defence Secretary. The Prime Minister's involvement that day would be accepting a call by Prince Sultan and hosting a dinner in the evening. The Saudis have asked whether it would be possible for the call on the Prime Minister to take place just prior to the dinner rather than separately in the afternoon. This seems sensible. We would envisage a call of say 45 minutes duration. If this approach appeals to the Prime Minister, we now need to firm up the timings of firstly the call and then the dinner, on which I should welcome your early advice. (The programme is due to go to press tomorrow).

I will provide further advice shortly on the suggested guest list for the dinner.

Could I also draw your attention to the programme on 27th September which involves a visit to BAe Warton and in the evening a dinner given by Prince Sultan. Unfortunately, the Defence Secretary is committed to leaving that day for Oman and, given Omani sensitivities, we have concluded that it would not be right to alter his plans: the Saudis are aware of this difficulty. We are therefore planning that Mr Lamont will accompany Prince Sultan. I should mention that the Saudis, on an unofficial channel, have enquired whether the Prime Minister would wish to take part in the visit to Warton - I assume she

would not. They have also, on an official channel, enquired about her availability for the dinner that evening - again I would assume that she would not wish to do this but I wonder whether we should not seek to depute an appropriately senior Cabinet Minister?

I should be most grateful for your early guidance.
