The French propose that the President and Prime Minister speak briefly (for about 5 minutes each) at the opening of the press conference to announce the decision on the Link : this is in line with what I believe we have been assuming. In their original proposal the French mentioned that the press conference would be followed by lunch "with speeches". The Elysee have now said that President Mitterrand does not envisage these speeches being long and formal; he will probably "take something out of his pocket". The Prime Minister would therefore be expected to speak rather more briefly than we had previously been contemplating. The foregoing has already been passed on to the Department of Transport at working level, and officials are taking the new proposed arrangements into account in their preparations. 
