1. CEM DUNA, ONE OF THE PRIME MINISTER'S PRINATE SECRETARILES, HAD TOLD ME THAT ALTHOUGH THE TURKS HAD CONSIDERED PRESSING FOR A QUACK RESPONSE TO THE SECRETARY GENERAL'S DRAFT FRAME-WORK AGREEMENT, THEY HAD NOW DECIDED TO LOOK MUCH MORE CLOSELY AT CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE TEXT. THEY WERE PARTICULARLY CONCERNED ABOUT THE AMBUGUATY AN THE UN STATEMENT AND REFERENCE TO TROOP WITHDRAWALS AND ADEQUATE GUARANTEES AND TO THE ROLE OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL.

2. DUNA SAND THAT THEY HAD RECOGNISED THE PUBLIC RELATIONS ADVANTAGES OF AN EARLY RESPONSE, BUT EQUALLY HAD LEARNED FROM DENKTASH'S ACCEPTANCE OF THE JANUARY DOCUMENT THAT THAS COULD LEAD TO FURTHER PRESSURE AND MORE CONCESSIONS AFTER THE GREEK CYPRIOTS HAD REFUSED TO ACCEPT HIT. THEY WOULD THEREFORE NEED MORE THME TO ASSESS HOW THE GREEKS WERE LAKELY TO RESPOND NOW.

3. DUNA LEFT ME WHITH THE HMPRESSION THAT THE TURKS WOULD ULTIMATELY BE ABLE TO LIVE WITH THE DRAFT AGREEMENT, BUT HIS COMMENTS ALSO SUGGEST THAT THE TURKS ARE NOT LOOKING AT THE DRAFT AGREEMENT AS PART OF AN MATEGRATED PACKAGE BUT ARE CONCERNED THAT HE THEY ACCEPT HT WHITHOUT THE GREEKS THEN HIT MAY BE USED AGAINST THEM IN THE FUTURE.
