## SUMMARY

- 1. THE SECRETARY GENERAL INTENDS TO TREAT KYPRIANOU'S RESPONSE AS A BLUFF AND TO SEEK TO CALL IT. HE LOOKS FORWARD TO DISCUSSING THE SITUATION WITH THE PRIME MINISTER NEXT WEEK.
- 2. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ASKED TO SEE ME THIS AFTERNOON, 7 MAY, TO TELL ME HOW HE HAD DECIDED TO PROCEED FOLLOWING THE RESPONSES FROM KYPRIANOU AND DENKTASH TO HIS DRAFT FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT. 3. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL SAID THAT HOLGER WOULD BE SEEING KYPRIANOU TOMORROW MORNING, 8 MAY, TO TELL HIM ''IN A VERY CLEAR WAY'' THAT HIS IDEAS (FOR AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OR A HIGH LEVEL MEETING) WERE NOT VIABLE AND THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL FELT OBLIGED TO STICK TO HIS DRAFT. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL SAID THAT HE HAD NO WISH TO BE UNPLEASANT WITH KYPRIANOUR BUT IT WOULD HAVE TO BE MADE CLEAR TO HIM THAT HIS BEST COURSE WOULD BE TO FOLLOW DENKTASH'S EXAMPLE AND REPLY POSITIVELY ALBEIT "WITH PLENTY OF IFS AND BUTS". HOLGER'S INSTRUCTIONS WERE TO TACKLE KYPRIANOU IN AN INFORMAL MANNER, NOT TO LEAVE ANY KIND OF TEXT WITH HIM (SINCE THIS WOULD CERTAINLY LEAK) AND TO IMPLY THAT THE BEST SOLUTION - IN THE INTEREST OF HIS OWN CAUSE - WAS TO GIVE A COMPARABLE ANSWER TO THAT OF DENKLASH. AT THE SAME TIME HOLGER WAS TO LET KYPRIANOU UNDERSTAND THAT WITHOUT SUCH AN ANSWER THE SECRETARY-GENERAL WOULD BE OBLIGED TO MAKE IT CLEAR TO THE SECURITY COUNCIL BEFORE THE END OF MAY THAT ONE PARTY HAD
- THOUGHT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S DECISION WAS EXACTLY RIGHT.

  KYPRIANOU'S OWN LETTER HAD GIVEN HIM THE OPENING TO REFUSE TO TAKE

  IT AS A REJECTION OF THE DRAFT FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT. IT WAS IMPORTANT

  TO TELL KYPRIANOU THAT HIS TWO PROPOSALS WOULD NOT WORK AND TO

  MAINTAIN THAT HIS ANSWER HAD NOT BEEN NEGATIVE. IN A CURIOUS WAY IT

  WAS NOW OPEN TO KYPRIANOU, HAVING BEEN SO OBDURATE HITHERTO, TO

  ACCEPT THE DRAFT FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT ON CONDITIONS ACCEPTABLE TO

  THE SECRETARY GENERAL BUTH WHICH KYPRIANOU HAD SO FAR REFUSED TO

  ADMIT. FOR EXAMPLE HE COULD ACCEPT THE FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT ON

  CONDITION THAT (AS THE SECRETARY-GENERAL AND THE PRIME MINISTER

  HAD SAID ALL ALONG) IT WAS NOT AN END IN ITSELF BUT A MEANS TO A

REPLIED POSITIVELY AND THE OTHER NEGATIVELY.

HIGH LEVEL MEETING AND PART OF A PACKAGE. THIS WAS THE ONLY ADVANTAGE OF THE STUPID POSITION HE HAD TAKEN AND MIGHT SAVE FACE AND EVEN ENABLE HIM TO LOOK QUITE TOUGH TO HIS OWN CONSTITUENTS. 5. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE UK AND THE US (HE ALSO MENTIONED THE COMMUNITY THOUGH THIS SEEMS TO TAKE TOO LITTLE ACCOUNT OF GREEK MEMBERSHIP) COULD PROVIDE THE SAME ADVICE TO KYPRIANOU AND TELL PAPANDREOU TO BE POSITIVE RATHER THAN NEGATIVE. I SAID THAT THE AMERICANS WERE PROBABLY BETTER PLACED TO TAKE ACTION WITH PAPANDREOU GIVEN THAT HE WAS ANGLING FOR AN INVITATION TO WASHINGTON, BUT THAT I THOUGHT WE MIGHT BE READY TO MAKE IT CLEAR DELICATELY TO KYPRIANOU THAT IF HE MISSED THIS CHANCE HE WOULD BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GREEK CYPRIOTS BEING WORSE OFF THAN EVER BEFORE. 6. I SUGGESTED THAT THIS WAS LIKELY TO BE A FRUITFUL SUBJECT FOR HIM TO DISCUSS WITH THE PRIME MINISTER NEXT WEEK. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL SAID HE WOULD BE GLAD TO DISCUSS IT WITH MRS THATCHER AND TELL HER HOW GRATEFUL HE WAS FOR HER SUPPORT. IT WAS AGREED THAT UNDER-SECRETARY-GENERAL GOULDING WOULD BE IN TOUCH WITH ME TOMORROW TO LET ME KNOW HOW HOLGER HAD GOT ON WITH KYPRIANOU.

7. I TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASK WHETHER THE SECRETARY-GENERAL HAD GIVEN ANY THOUGHT TO THE APPOINTMENT OF A NEW SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL WANTED TO BE VERY CAREFUL ABOUT THE TIMING OF ANY NEW APPOINTMENT. ALTHOUGH THERE WERE ARGUMENTS EITHER WAY HE THOUGHT IT WAS MORE LIKELY THAT A NEW APPOINTMENT WOULD BE INAPPROPRIATE AS SHOWING RESIGNATION TO SLOW DOWN IN THE PACE OF HIS INITIATIVE. IN ANY CASE HE WOULD WANT TO WAIT FOR THE NEXT RENEWAL OF THE UNFICYP MANDATE ON 15 JUNE.
