MY TELNO 473: AFGHANISTAN: UN TALKS

1. PAKISTANI PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE BRIEFED ME THIS AFTERNOON (8 AUGUST). AHMAD SAID THAT THE BACKDROP TO THE RECENT SESSION HAD BEEN ''OMINOUS''. SINCE THE LAST ROUND, THE SOVIET UNION HAD ADHERED FIRMLY TO A FOUR YEAR WITHDRAWAL PERIOD: THIS WAS TOTALLY UNACCEPTABLE. IN THE INTERIM, SOVIET PRESSURE ON PAKISTAN, IN THE FORM OF E.G.SABOTAGE ACIVITIES, HAD BEEN STEPPED UP. PAKISTAN HAD ALSO BEEN CONCERNED AT THE SOVIET DEMARCHE ON NUCLEAR MATTERS OF 21 JUNE. HOWEVER, THE ATMOSPHERE IMPROVED WITH THE VLADIVOSTOK ANNOUNCEMENT, WHICH HAD BEEN DESCRIBED IN ISLAMABAD AS A WELCOME FIRST STEP.

- 2. AT THE TALKS, AHMAD SAID THERE HAD BEEN NO SOVIET NOVEMENT ON THE LENGTH OF WITHDRAWAL PERIOD. THE PAKISTANI SIDE WOULD HAVE BEEN WILLING TO FEVISE ITS OWN PROPOSAL IF A NEW SOVIET OFFER HAD APPEARED. CORDOVEZ HAD ASSURED THEM THAT A FRESH SOVIET OFFER WOULD COME, BUT ONLY AT OR NEAR THE END OF THE NEGOTIATING PROCESS.
- 3. HOWEVER, REGOTIATIONS ON MONITORING HAD SCORED A SUCCESS. THE SOVIET UNION HAD INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD AGREE TO UN MONITORING OF THE AGREEMENT AS A WHOLE. THE DETAILS WOULD REED TO BE ELABORATED. UN MONITORING WAS OF COURSE COMPLETELY ACCEPTABLE TO PAKISTAN.
- 4. THERE HAD BEEN NO DISCUSION OF REFUGEES, AS BROAD AGREEMENT HAD EEEN REACHED AT EARLIER TALKS: BUT MODALITIES GOVERNING THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES WOULD NEED TO BE WORKED OUT. THE SHORTER THE TROOP WITHDRAWAL PERIOD, THE EASIER IT WOULD BE TO CONVINCE THE REFUGEES

- 5. CORDOVEZ WOULD NOW KEEP IN TOUCH WITH THE PARTIES CONCERNED. HE WOULD THEN DECIDE FROM THESE CONTACTS WHEN THE NEXT MEETING SHOULD BE.
- 6. AHMAD SAID THE SOVIET UNION HAD NEGOTIATED SERIOUSLY, AND APPEARED TO WART TO SETTLE. HE WAS OPTIMISTIC.
- 7. THE PAKISTAN FOREIGN MINISTER WILL BE TRANSITTING LONDON TONIGHT BEFORE LEAVING FOR DACCA TOMORROW TO ATTEND A MEETING OF THE SOUTHERN ASIAN COUNCIL.
