ATP: CYPRUS

and reavest of reavered Thank you for your letter of 2 October to Steven Phillips. I am not certain that the apparent misunderstandings to which you refer are yet fully clarified.

There is no dispute at all over the terms of the relevant EX decision, nor your record of my Minister's meeting with the Chief Secretary on 1 August. However, the purpose of Steven's letter of 9 September was to record that the condition in your letter of 1 August that "the Chief Secretary would not accept any further cases in Cyprus in the foreseeable future", appeared inconsistent with EX's decision that ATP could be used, albeit exceptionally, in countries such as Cyprus. It is our clear understanding of EX's decision that in a developing country such as Cyprus where there is a track record of aid offers made by our competitors, there is now no question of principle over whether the market is a regular recipient of aid. Accordingly ATP should be available as for other developing countries. Its commitment will depend, as with any ATP application, upon the merits of the individual case and be subject to normal inter-Departmental consideration. Of course, overall, the commitment of ATP to countries such as Cyprus is bound to be relatively small and exceptional.

On initiations and matching, I do not think that there is anything between us - I entirely agree with your description of the relevant EX decision.
