Mr Gorbachev's Visit

The Soviet reconnaissance team led by Ambassador Chernishev, Chief of Protocol, returned to Moscow on 21 March. He was unable to tell us who will be coming with Mr Gorbachev although he promised details later this week, but advised that we should work on the basis of a delegation comprising the same principals and suite as on the last occasion. In consequence we are resurrecting the separate programmes drawn up for Mr Shevardnadze, Mr Yakovlev and Mr Kamentsev with some minor modifications.

Ad referendum we and Mr Chernishev have agreed the attached programme. It is as already approved by the Prime Minister with some minor changes resulting from travel times and Soviet preferences. The main problem at the moment concerns the selection of a factory to visit. We, the Soviet Embassy, and the recce team looked at five factories suggested by the DTI. The front-runners were Celltech and John Crane at Slough (biotechnology and seals) and United Biscuits at Harlesden. All have modern technology in areas relevant to the USSR. A visit to United Biscuits would have provided the opportunity for the signing of a £60 million contract for APV cereal lines. John Crane had hoped to use the occasion to have their plant formally opened. Although Chernishev and Zamyatin reported to Moscow that John Crane was the right choice, Zamyatin has now changed his mind. The DTI are putting forward further suggestions including Marconi at St Albans, Case at Watford and British Aerospace at Hatfield. It is impossible to find anything suitable closer to the centre of London. I shall keep you informed.

The Queen has offered a Guard of Honour at Windsor Castle. There will be a "carpet guard" on arrival and departure and a band to play the Soviet national anthem.

The Russians have opted for what amounts to a sight-seeing drive through London for Mrs Gorbachev. They have picked St Pauls, Tower Bridge, and tentatively, the Burlington Arcade as stopping places. She does not want to go to any museums except the Museum of London. We are picking the most scenic route between the stopping places. The Russians have also turned down any participation by children and have resisted all pressure to relent on this.

The arrangements for the Guildhall speech are being modelled on President Reagan's visit. The Russians are pleased with this and have been given a video of the Reagan ceremony with which to brief Mr Gorbachev. President Reagan brought his own podium and autocue. The Guildhall does not have one and the Russians do not want to bring their own. They are happy to use any podium considered suitable for use by the Prime Minister. Does she have any views?

Those invited both to the Guildhall and to Windsor castle will have a problem getting from the one to the other in time unless they travel with a policy convoy. The Gorbachevs will be going via the Soviet Residence. The Prime Minister will, I take it, be going direct. Would she mind if a small motorcade was made up to include other guests of The Queen? If she is content we shall arrange this with the police and City authorities.

One or two points of detail need agreement:

(a) In December Mr Thatcher was intending to present Mrs Gorbachev with flowers at the airport. Is this still the plan? If not would the Prime Minister like us to make other arrangements? We have a Russian speaking girl in our Soviet Department. The Russians will have an Embassy staff member (male) on hand with flowers for both the Gorbachevs.

(b) I take it that Mr Thatcher is still prepared to travel into London from Heathrow with Mrs Gorbachev. [Yes].

(c) At the No 10 dinner it would speed things up if the short speeches/toasts were distributed on the table in English and Russian according to requirements thus avoiding the necessity for interpretation. This was how it was done in Moscow in 1987. Would the Prime Minister like this or prefer interpretation?

(d) The Gorbachevs have elected to travel together to the factory. Lord Young will go with them but in a separate car. Mr Baker would not therefore go as well. Is the Prime Minister content? *Yes*

(e) Will Mr Thatcher go to the Guildhall? *[Yes - I have asked]*

(f) At present no-one included in The Queen's lunch will have been escorting Mrs Gorbachev. Unless Mr Thatcher wishes to go to Windsor just to meet the party on departure in order to escort Mrs Gorbachev to the airport, the best solution would probably be for Sir Rodric Braithwaite to travel with her. Would the Prime Minister be happy with this? *[Mr. Barber has said that he is willing to go to Windsor. I think this is better]. Yes*

MR. GORBACHEV'S VISIT

Thank you for your letter of 23 March about the programme for Mr. Gorbachev's visit. I have shown this to the Prime Minister and she is in general content with it, subject to hearing what is decided for the factory visit. She thinks it a pity that the Russians have turned down any participation by children in Mrs. Gorbachev's programme, but sees no point in reopening this.

To deal with the questions in the later part of your letter:

- the Prime Minister would like her usual autocue podium at the Guildhall. I should be grateful if you could arrange with Mr. Harvey Thomas for this to be installed;
- she would be ready for other guests at The Queen's lunch to be formed in a motorcade from the Guildhall to Windsor;
- the Prime Minister would like the Russian speaking girl in Soviet department to present flowers to Mrs. Gorbachev on her arrival rather than Mr. Thatcher;
- Mr. Thatcher will indeed travel into London from Heathrow with Mrs. Gorbachev (and presumably an interpreter);
- we will have texts of speeches at the No. 10 dinner translated and distributed to avoid the need for interpretation. We shall need television cameras present for the speeches;
- the Prime Minister is content for Lord Young to go on the factory visit. She does not think it necessary for Mr. Baker to go as well;
- Mr. Thatcher will attend the Guildhall occasion;

- Mr. Thatcher will go to Windsor and arrive in time to escort Mrs. Gorbachev from there to Heathrow.
