BBC T V LICENCE FEE EVASION

Thank you for your letter of 14 November.

The Lord Chancellor has noted the Home Secretary's view that BBC TV licence fee evasion should remain a criminal offence for the time being, but that decriminalisation should be considered again in a few year's time in the context of the renewal of the BBC charter.

The Lord Chancellor has no objections to this course of action and is also content with the proposal to close the present legal loophole associated with the "availability of use" of television receivers, by creating a new summary criminal offence of having an unlicenced television receiver available for use.
