EAST WEST RELATIONS

I attach the Foreign Office's reply to the letter which I sent on your behalf asking for work to be done on the implications of the changes in Eastern Europe for our foreign and defence policy. The reply suggests plenty of activity but tells us very little about the nature of it.

I think you will need to get together those principally concerned, perhaps one Saturday or Sunday at Chequers, to talk it through. I think it is worth waiting for some papers to emerge so that we have a solid base for discussion. In practical terms this points towards a date at the end of January/early February.

Would you agree to a little internal seminar at Chequers at that time? It might be attended by
