BROADCASTING BILL: PERFORMANCE BONDS

Thank you for your letter of 6 February to the Chancellor. has asked me to reply.

- I am content with your proposals; except for the suggestion that surrendered performance bonds should not be paid in their entirety into the Consolidated Fund. I believe that they should as the Bill already provides - in order to maintain proper Parliamentary control of the funds.
- You suggested two other possible uses for the funds. But I do not accept the need for either. There is no reason to return any part of a performance bond to a failed licensee; and the ITC is unlikely to have difficulty persuading one licensee to take on, rent-free, the broadcasting obligations and privileges surrendered by another. If it does then the ITC should consider relaxing its programme requirements.
- I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister, other MISC 128 colleagues and to Sir Robin Butler.
