BROADCASTING BILL: PERFORMANCE BONDS

Thank you for your letter of 3 May. I have also seen Eric Forth's letter of 10 May and the Prime Minister's comments of 11 May.

I am content with your proposal. However it will create a new incentive for licensees to arrange their affairs so that a company holding a Channel 3 licence can go bankrupt to avoid paying any termination fine, while related companies continue to trade. The effect would be to weaken the ITC's ability to enforce licence conditions, including the annual payments to the Exchequer promised at the auction. You may wish to consider reducing the scope for such potential evasion - for example by ensuring termination fines can be collected from holding companies, or directors, of licensees.
