As it stands this will weaken even the present inadequate legal safeguards, and,

amongst other things, will certainly make our life more difficult at the next General Election.

I will of course listen to the arguments, but I have been close to this subject for several years, and fear I shall have to support the amendments tabled by Lord Orr-Ewing and others. It would be a great relief if the Government could reach agreement with them beforehand.

I know its only one vote, but in the circumstances it would be a particularily painful one, and I felt I should contact you in advance.
