Dear Sir,

I enclose a letter to Stanley Hartt about the Ankara Metro Project which he raised with me in the margins of the Economic Summit in Houston. I would be most grateful if you could pass it on to him.

Relations between the Prime Minister and Mr. Mulroney were extremely cordial, both at the NATO Summit and the Economic Summit and she had a good talk with him in the margins of the former. He appeared very depressed in London, but had cheered up a good deal by the time of Houston, and obviously enjoyed the glitz. Stanley Hartt told me that he had been much encouraged by the Prime Minister's advice to him to seize the initiative and come forward with fresh proposals of his own on the constitutional problem, rather than wait for Quebec to do so: he was now full of ideas and intended to galvanise his colleagues.
