

- e. ORBAT (detailed) of Argentinian army.

- a. Details of any refits of Argentinian ships in France, particularly any change in weapon fits.
- b. Can DE MAYO operate the Super Etendard; are the aircraft embarked?
- c. Is the Super Etendard fitted with EXOCET missiles

 (NB we have a report that SNIAS are working overtime at the present moment to get these fitted now) and what are their operational capability?
- d. Types and characteristics of any sonar equipment supplied to the Argentinian Navy.
- e. ESM and Communications equipment supplied to Argentinian Navy; capability of all naval units fitted.





- A. Your 2038/1/1 of 6 Apr 82.
- 1. The DIS already have our specific requirements to date.

 The details of enemy weapons systems are of interest to us although we see the Navy, Army and Air Force Departments as being rather more concerned with them than ourselves we, therefore, propose to leave that side of the "shopping list" to them.
- 2. However, we are keen to know about any enemy activity that could affect the planning or execution of our operations. We, therefore are more concerned with such matters as:
 - a. Photographic coverage (by SR 71?) of Argentinian dispositions at sea, and on the Falkland Islands and South Georgia.
 - b. Information giving any minelaying at sea and on land.
 - c. A trace showing Argentinian radar coverage.
 - d. Any signs of significant military concentrations or unusual military activity on the Argentine mainland or her islands close to the mainland.
 - e. Indications of any military assistance for Argentina from the countries friendly to her.

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3. Should the DIS consider that it cannot adequately cover this strategic information, then perhaps they could suggest where the USA, or France, could fill the gaps.
