OPERATION CORPORATE

ITEM 1. INTELLIGENCE MATTERS

- 1. SIR HENRY LEACH (Acting Chief of the Defence Staff) invited the Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence) to update them on current intelligence.
- LIEUTENANT GENERAL GLOVER (Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence)) reviewed the intelligence situation, as outlined (1) in his latest signalled summary. In the subsequent discussion he said he would give the Chief of the Naval Staff later that day a Defence Intelligence Staff assessment of the report (2) that mines might have been laid in the entrance to Port William in the Falkland Islands.

ITEM 2. OWN FORCES

- There had been no changes to the Force Tote Sitrep (3) already published.
- SIR DAVID CRAIG (representing the Chief of the Air Staff) said that 9 Victor aircraft would arrive on Ascension Island in the next two days. On arrival they would come under the operational command and control of the Air Officer Commanding . 18 Group as Air Commander responsible to the Commander-in-Chief Fleet.

ITEM 3. PUBLIC RELATIONS

MR McDONALD (Deputy Chief of Public Relations) reviewed the major articles in the daily newspapers.

- 6. In discussion the following points were made:
 - a. The Permanent Under Secretary intended to discuss again with London newspaper editors the desirability of avoiding the publication of reports which might be construed as irresponsible or mischievous. The Chief of the Naval Staff would take similar action privately with those retired senior naval officers who had made public comments.
 - b. There should be no official comment on the return of HMS SUPERB to Faslane, nor should publicity be given to the requisitioning of MV NORLAND.

ITEM 4. DECISIONS REQUIRED

- 7. The Committee reviewed the forecast of decisions (4). A revised forecast is at Annex A.
- 8. SIR HENRY LEACH informed the Committee that Ministers had agreed (5) Rules of Engagement for Operation PARAQUET. These covered three sets of circumstances: operations on the high seas; operations within the Argentine-declared 200nm zone; and the operation to repossess South Georgia. He had authorised Commander Task Force 317 (CTF 317) to implement the high seas package. The Operation PARAQUET high seas rules had also been passed to CTF 317 for use by HMS BRILLIANT's group when authorised by further signal; that authorisation had not yet been given.
- 9. In discussion the point was made that it was essential to correlate military and political decisions, and identify any critical factors in their timing. Political factors were complicated by the uncertainties surrounding the outcome of US Secretary of State Haig's mission, but it should be possible to forecast when military decisions would be needed if planned operations were not to be delayed.
- 10. Summing up, SIR HENRY LEACH said they would wish to instruct the Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Operations), in conjunction with the Navy and Air Force Departments:

ITEM 5. STUDY INTO THE SCOPE FOR DELAYING LANDING OPERATIONS IN THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

11. The Committee agreed Terms of Reference (7) for a study into the scope for delaying landing operations in the Falkland Islands, as amended by them in discussion.

- 12. SIR HENRY LEACH said they would wish to consider a report (9) from our Air Attache (designate) in Chile.
- 13. Summing up their discussion, SIR HENRY LEACH said they would wish to instruct the Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Operations), in conjunction with the Air Force Department and the Defence Secretariat, to prepare a draft submission to the Secretary of State for their consideration at their meeting the next day.
