FOLLOWING FOR PRIVATE SECRETARY FROM PUS

YOU WILL HAVE SEEN OUR TELEGRAM TO BERNE, REPEATED TO WASHINGTON, TODAY ASKING THE SWISS TO CONVEY TO THE ARGENTINES A WARNING NOT TO APPROACH THE BRITISH TASK FORCE WITH SHIPS OR AIRCRAFT AND NOT TO CONDUCT AERIAL SURVEILLANCE OF BRITISH SHIPS. I THOUGHT THE SECRETARY OF STATE MIGHT LIKE TO BE REASSURED THAT THE LANGUAGE USED IS LARGELY THAT ALREADY APPROVED BY ODSA AND HAS BEEN THOROUGHLY DISCUSSED HERE BY ALL CONCERNED INCLUDING THE PRIME MINISTER. THE NEED TO WARN THE ARGENTINES QUICKLY AROSE PARTICULARLY FROM THE NEED TO GIVE THE TASK FORCE DIRECTIONS ON HOW TO COPE WITH CONTINUED SURVEILLANCE BY ARGENTINE 707S. IT IS AGREED THAT THE TASK FORCE COMMANDER SHOULD HAVE AUTHORITY TO INTERCEPT, WARN OFF AND HARASS SUCH AIRCRAFT WITH OUR SEA HARRIERS, EVEN TO THE POINT OF FIRING ACROSS THEIR PATH. BUT A FURTHER PROPOSAL THAT IF THIS FAILS THERE SHOULD BE INSTRUCTIONS ACTUALLY TO ATTACK SUCH SURVEILLANCE AIRCRAFT REMAINS TO BE PUT TO MINISTERS AND I HAVE ENTIRELY RESERVED OUR POSITION ON THIS PENDING THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S RETURN, WHEN I CAN BRIEF HIM MORE
