- 1. FRENCH PRESS REACTIONS AGAIN VARY. THE OVERALL BALANCE IS REASONABLE BUT THERE ARE EXCEPTIONS. THE TONE OF REPORTING IN THE COMMUNIST L'HUMANITE REMAINS CRITICAL. SUZANNET OF LE FIGARO CONTINUES TO MAKE SNIDE REMARKS, AND THE LEFT WING LIBERATION COMMENTS ON THE ALLEGED ECONOMIC MOTIVES BEHIND BRITAIN'S READINESS TO FIGHT OVER UNINHABITED PILES OF ROCK. TATU, ONE OF THE DIPLOMATIC EDITORS OF LE MONDE, ENDS AN ARTICLE WHICH HE COMMENTS IRONICALLY ABOUT BRITAIN'S ROLE IN THE COMMUNITY WITH THE CONCLUSION THAT FRANCE HAS PERHAPS GONE TOO FAR IN SUPPORTING BRITAIN.
