FALKLAND ISLANDS: RULES OF ENGAGEMENT FOR OPERATION PARAQUET

1. In my minute to the Private Secretary of 15 April I reported that the MOD would be circulating papers for today's meetings of officials under Sir R Armstrong at 11.00 and of Ministers at OD(SA)and on rules of engagement for the recapture of South Georgia. I have now received from the MOD a revised version of the rules of engagement which will be discussed at Sir R Armstrong's meeting. I have not yet received papers for OD(SA).

- 2. The revised rules of engagement are an improvement over the version discussed at the Chiefs of Staff meeting yesterday. Some effort has been made to deal with problems connected with attacks without warning on merchant ships. We are however still left with the problem of risks of inadvertent attacks on Soviet submarines.
- 3. I  $\frac{\text{recommend}}{\text{take the}}$  that at Sir R Armstrong's meeting the PUS should  $\frac{\text{take the}}{\text{take the}}$  following line on these two points:

#### a. Attacks on merchant ships

The inclusion of Rule 202 in phase 2 and in phase 3 of the operation (annexes B and C) delegates authority to commanders to 'warn off enemy units'. Nevertheless suffix Mike, allowing attacks on all vessels positively identified as Argentinian (which include merchant shipping), still stands. There is therefore some risk of ambiguity (see sub paragraph c below). In Annex C the inclusion of suffix November allows attacks on aircraft (including civil aircraft) positively identified as Argentinian. Thus attacks without warning on merchant shipping and civil aircraft are still a possibility.

#### b. Soviet submarines

The risk of attack on Soviet submarines still remains. Suffix Juliett in phases 2 and 3 allows attacks on all submarines detected which are assessed to be conventional. This is based on the assumption that no conventional submarines except Argentine submarines will be in the area and that RN surface ships can distinguish between conventional and nuclear powered submarines. The former point is speculative; and we know that the latter may not be the case.





#### c. General

In general the revision made to the rules of engagement following yesterday's meeting of the Chiefs of Staff has, if anything, made them less comprehensible than they were before. I frankly doubt whether naval commanders will obtain from them a clear picture of what they are supposed to do (see sub-paragraph (a) above). It is not for example clear what is meant by the word 'Argentinian' in the middle of pages B2 and C2. Furthermore, the rule of engagement No 5 (pages B3 and C3) refers to the 'classification' of submarines as nuclear powered. I do not know what this is supposed to mean; and I very much doubt whether a submarine commander would understand either.

4. At this morning's meeting with the Secretary of State, it was agreed that there is no need now to reach decisions on the rules of engagement for phase 2 and 3 (Annexes B and C). Only Annex A referring to phase 1 (transit of the high seas) is of immediate relevance. I therefore further recommend that at Sir R Armstrong's meeting today the PUS should argue that Ministers should not be / into hasty decisions on Annexes B and C. We can however agree now with the rules for the first phase (Annex A). These give rise to no difficulties.

## RULES OF ENGAGEMENT FOR OPERATION PARAQUET

- There are three sets of instructions which need to be agreed for issue to ships involved in Operation Paraquet. These cover:
  - Transit towards South Georgia on the a. high seas outside any declared Zone:
  - b. Transit within the declared Argentinian "Defence Zone" of 200 nautical miles around South Georgia:
  - Execution of Operation Paraquet within c. this Zone.
- The Rules of Engagement to cover these three phases involve the following:
  - Transit towards South Georgia a.

Overriding aim is to avoid provocation but respond to aggression with firmness.

i. Surface Vessels

> Minimum force to be used in response to any clear intent to engage. All units may assist in defence of any unit which is attacked. Maritime International Law is not to be broken unless necessary in order to achieve aim.
