

- 2. ITEM ONE INTELLIGENCE. INTSUM for 0600Z is at FLAG B; map illustrating Argentine and UK deployments is at LH Side. Argentinian deployments to the South are far greater than is necessary for the FIs alone. Soviet satellites are in regular operation. Argentine ships are clear of MES. Tigercat SAMs are positioned near STANLEY, and maritime and recce of the Atlantic Ocean near the FIs appears to have been implemented.
- Tote is at FLAG C. Warships of TU 317.8.1 are now at ASI, although some RFAs have yet to arrive. CINCFLEET is to visit them today for briefing. INVINCIBLE stbd coupling has been rectified and she can make speeds in excess of 25 kts. COVENTRY, GLASGOW and ARROW are limited to 21 kts because of engine defects. NORLAND is requisitioned on arrival at Hull today. 848 Sqn is reforming with 12 x Wessex 5 and will be at 24 hrs notice to deploy wef 19 Apr. Third Nimrod Mk 2 due at ASI today. RAF Harriers are making good progress towards ski-jump CA release. 2 Para are at 72 hrs notice wef 0900Z today.
- 4. ITEM THREE PUBLIC RELATIONS. Firstly, you should lay down a marker with DCPR that the media must be more responsible with their reporting. Specifically, TV reports last night and the press this morning have openly praised the two newly-released RAF airmen for their intelligence gathering. The effect of this, I believe, is to destroy any hope we might have had of an early release for the Marines currently in Argentinian custody. Secondly, you should be aware that journalists are not being allowed to land at ASI, and this will probably make them miffed.
