## FALKLAND ISLANDS

1. You raised at your meeting this morning the Argentine capability to fly helicopters direct from the mainland to the Falkland Islands, as blockade runners. Assuming the helicopters take off from the hearest air base, Rio Grande, the following could complete the journey:
