: FROM DIRECTOR. SPECIAL JIC HIGHLIGHTS ON 27 APRIL 1982: D 1 REPRESENTED +C+. DGI ALONE REPRESENTED MOD.

IMMEDIATE ASSESSMENTS. THE CHAIRMAN CONGRATULATED THE ASSESSMENT STAFF AND ITS SUPPORTING CIG ON THE EXCELLENCE OF THEIR WORK. IT WAS LEFT TO A SOMEWHAT EMBARRASSED BGI TO CONVEY THE CONTINUING (ALBEIT DIMINISHING) WORRIES OF THE CHIEFS OF STAFF.

WHOSE PAIN PROBLEM WOULD SEEM TO BE THAT OF BEING EXPOSED TO THE

SAME INTELLIGENCE SEVERAL TIMES OVER: HAVING RECEIVED A MOD INTSUM

AND AN FCO SITREP FIRST THING, THEY ARE GIVEN A FURTHER BRIEFING

BY DCDS(I) AT THEIR DAILY 1838 MEETING (AND SOMETIMES AT A SECOND MEETING AT 1438 AS WELL). NOT ALTOGETHER SURPRISINGLY. THE COS THEN FIND THAT THE DAILY INMEDIATE ASSESSMENT, WHICH REACHES THEM MID-AFTERNOON BUT IS OFTEN NOT READ TILL THE FOLLOWING HORNING. HAS A SOMEWHAT HISTORICAL FLAVOUR. THE FACTS REMAIN HOWEVER THAT: A. THERE ARE MANY OTHER READERS WHO FIND THE IMMEDIATE ASSESSMENT OF CONSIDERABLE VALUE: B. THE IMMEDIATE ASSESSMENT IS THE ONE AND ONLY ALL-SOURCE ASSESSMENT OF ALL ASPECTS OF THE CRISIS. 3. AFTER MUCH DEBATE THE JIC MOUNTAIN HEAVED AND PRODUCED TWO SMALL MICE: A. THE TITLE WILL BE CHANGED FROM +IMMEDIATE ASSESSMENT+ TO +DAILY ASSESSMENT PRODUCED AT (TIME) ON (DATE)+, THUS HAKING ITS READERS MORE AWARE OF ITS TRUE CHARACTER: B. IN THE DRAFTING PROCESS. RATHER MORE ATTENTION WILL BE PAID N TO TENSES: FOR EXAMPLE. IN JIC(82)(1A)43. +BRITISH FORCES HAVE RECAPTURED SOUTH GEORGIA+ MIGHT HAVE BEEN MORE HAPPILY WORDED +BRITISH FORCES RECAPTURED SOUTH GEORGIA YESTER DAY+. 4. ALL THAT HAVING BEEN SAID, DGI WAS ON FIRMER GROUND WHEN HE INFORMED THE COMMITTEE THAT CDS CONSIDERED THE JIC OUTPUT TO BE +PROGRESSIVELY MORE USEFUL +. (NONE OF THIS WHITEHALL IN-FIGHTING I SHOULD. INCIDENTALLY. BE TAKEN AS A REFLECTION ON THE SIGINT OUTPUT. ON WHICH SUBJECT I SHALL BE REPORTING SOME HEART-WARMING WORDS FROM CDS IN PERSON.) 5. SPECIAL MACHINERY FOR ASSESSING INTELLIGENCE IN A PERIOD OF HOSTILITIES. THE PROPOSALS MENTIONED IN PARA 9 OF MY 221550 AND SET OUT IN DETAIL IN JICSS 221730 HAD APPAREATLY MET WITH A HOSTILE RECEPTION AT COS LEVEL. THE COS PREFERENCE IS THAT THE PRESENT MACHINERY. WHEREBY A DIS +SPECIAL ASSESSMENT STAFF+ (HEADED BY AIR CORE ASHFORD) PROVIDES INSTANT PAPERS ON A WIDE RANGE OF CRISIS-RELATE TOPICS WITHOUT JIC INTERVENTION, SHOULD CONTINUE: THE CHAIRMAN AND CO-ORDINATOR FELT THAT WE HAD NO OPTION BUT TO AGREE THE COS VIEW. THUS THE PROJECTED MILITARY SUB-COMMITTEE OF JIC WILL NOT. AFTER ALL. BE ESTABLISHED.

6. IT WAS HOWEVER AGREED THAT:

A. TO ENSURE MAXIMUM FLOW OF IMPORMATION AND TO AFFORD OPPORTUNITIES FOR CROSS-FERTILISATION. PAPERS GENERATED BY THE DIS SPECIAL STAFF SHOULD BE COPIED TO ALL JIC MEMBERS (AND TO ASSESSMENT STAFF):

B. TO ENSURE THAT THE CHAIRMAN AND DG1 WERE IN A POSITION TO

STEER (RESPECTIVELY) FCO AND MOD IN THE LIGHT OF THE MOST UP-TO-DATE JIC/CIG VIEWS, HEAD OF ASSESSMENT STAFF WOULD SHOW THEM THE DAILY ASSESSMENT (QUONDAM IMMEDIATE ASSESSMENT) AS SOON AS THE DRAFT HAD BEEN FINALISED BY THE CIG: THE INTENTION HOWEVER WAS THUS TO INFORM THE CHAIRMAN AND DGI RATHER THAN TO INVITE THEIR COMMENTS.

7. GIVEN THAT WE NOW HAVE OUR OWN REPRESENTATIVE IN MOD, I BELIEVE THAT WE CAN LIVE WITH THESE REVISED ARRANGEMENTS.

8. REVIEW OF JIC MEETING ARRANGEMENTS. IT WAS AGREED THAT THE JIC SHOULD MEET TWICE A WEEK FOR THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE, NORMALLY AT 1530 ON MONDAY (UKEA SESSION FOR FALKLANDS CRISIS ITEMS) AND 1120 ON THURSDAY (NORMAL ATTENDANCE AND

I MADE THE POINT THAT IT WOULD NOT ALWAYS BE POSSIBLE FOR ME OR,
IN MY ABSENCE, DR (OR DP) TO ATTEND, AND HENCE THAT GCHO
WOULD ON OCCASIONS BE REPRESENTED AT DIVISION HEAD RATHER THAN
DIRECTORATE LEVEL. THIS WAS READILY ACCEPTED, AND I HAVE DISCUSSED
THIS ASPECT SUBSEQUENTLY WITH DR.

9. UNDER AGD, THE CHAIRMAN GAVE THE COMMITTEE AN ACCOUNT OF HOW
MATTERS STOOD GENERALLY IN RELATION TO THE CRISIS. THE PROPOSALS

WHICH MR HAIG IS NOW PUTTING TO THE ARGENTINE AUTHORITIES ARE

RECOMMENDED BY THE FOREIGN SECRETARY. TO THE CABINET

MINISTERS HAVE NOT YET COLLECTIVELY ACCEPTED THEM. THIS

WILL NOT GREATLY MATTER IF (AS THE FCO EXPECTS. THOUGH HAIG TAKES
