1. Mr Renwick rang the Emergency Unit from Washington, after failing to reach you. Mr Haig had been in touch with the Embassy with reference to Mr Nott and Mr Weinberger meeting in Brussels, to express the hope that no formal 'shopping list' would be presented to the Americans until a reply had been sent to Mr Haig's latest proposals. Sir N Henderson had been able to tell Mr Haig that a reply would be given him shortly, for which Mr Haig expressed gratitude.

2. Mr Renwick believes that if the reply to the Haig proposal is as positive as the Ambassador has been given to understand, there would be no difficulty about going ahead with any formal request for materiel. However, he thought it wise to pass on this request from Mr Haig. I do not know whether Mr Nott has any plans to present a 'shopping list' but you may wish to draw Mr Haig's request to the attention of the relevant people in the MOD.

'shopping list'. His brief suggests that he should discuss in general terms the kind of areas in which American assistance might be useful (ie intelligence, logistic support and equipment). I have been assured by the MOD that Mr Nott is not in a position at this juncture to go into any detailed list of requirements.
