Protestors at Greenham Common

This meeting has been called to discuss the Home Secretary's minute of 21 February at Flag A.

You have not yet seen the Secretary of State for Transport's minute at Flag B in which he argues that he must proceed soon with clearing the land needed for a road improvement scheme. He could do this whether or not there is a general move against the protestors, but the issue could conveniently be considered in the course of the meeting.

PROTESTERS AT GREENHAM COMMON

I have seen a copy of the Home Secretary's minute to you of 21 February together with the paper by officials and Counsels' joint advice on the prospects for concerted civil action against the so-called Greenham Common Peace Camp.

Whatever is decided about a general co-ordinated approach (which looks less than promising), I think we must proceed as soon as possible with the minor road improvement scheme at the junction of the trunk road and the main access to the air base. The roadworks are needed for road safety and traffic reasons. To do the works, I must repossess the highway land in the vicinity of the junction. The campers and their dwellings will have to go. It is likely that the two local authorities will take some simultaneous eviction action. As the Home Secretary points out in his minute, while this would not achieve total clearance it would be a significant step forward and can be done without the apparent degree of provocation that a more general move against the women might provoke.

The roadworks should start by early April if the present contractor is to be used. Delay beyond then will mean that another contractor has to be found; this will put back the scheme by 3 months. Unless therefore you

and my colleagues feel strongly that I should hold my hand, I would propose to instruct my officials to proceed.
