You asked about figures which the Prime Minister could use for North Sea oil and gas as a percentage of (i) GDP, (ii) Government revenue and (iii) exports (both goods and goods and services).

North Sea oil and gas as a percentage of GDP should be described as "about 6 per cent". I attach a note by Mr Walton of EB explaining this.

The figure of 8½ per cent for North Sea oil and gas as a percentage of Government revenue is correct for 1984/85, as forecast in the Autumn Statement.

The 21 per cent figure you mentioned relates only to oil, not oil and gas, as a proportion of total <u>visible</u> exports in 1984. The 1984 proportion of oil in exports of goods and services based on the Autumn Statement forecast is 16.5 per cent.

2. The implicit all purpose formulation is thus that oil and gas account for "about 6 per cent" of GDP. This needs to be used from now on in place of the erroneous "about 5" formulation. The latter seems to have crept into briefing at the end of last month - not from EB - though perhaps we were remiss in not checking it!
