Hong Kong: Joint Liaison Group (JLG)

In your letter of 24 April you indicated that the Prime Minister attaches the highest importance to securing the presence of Mr Ho on the JLG.

The Prime Minister may wish to know that the Chinese Government have now accepted that Eric Ho should be designated as a member of the British side of the Joint Liaison Group, on the basis that he becomes a full British citizen. They rejected our previous offer to issue a special passport to him without actually changing his nationality status.

As Christine Heald has reported, the Home Secretary has registered Ho as a British citizen under Section 4(5) of the BNA.
