Thank you very much for your letter of 16 April. It was most helpful to have this detailed account of your thinking on Middle East economic development issues prior to the Tokyo Summit. I was able to have a word with President Reagan about it in Tokyo.

I am determined to do what I can to promote further progress towards a political settlement which will assure the region's future stability, while maintaining absolute firmness in the face of terrorism. I am looking forward greatly to my own visit to Israel and the opportunity to continue the important and stimulating discussions we had in London, and see what we can do together to make further steps towards peace.

I share your analysis of the danger that the fall in oil prices (which of course affects us also) could hamper this process and cause some countries of the region serious economic difficulties. These deserve sympathy and understand-We will be ready to play our part in the appropriate multilateral institutions when the time comes.

I must add that greatly as I respect its objectives I am less optimistic than you that it will be practicable under present circumstances to set up a regional economic programme. As you point out, the political and economic issues are inextricably linked and I have serious doubts about the readiness

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of the Arab governments to participate in multi-national arrangements: which they might well see as premature in the absence of further moves towards a settlement of the political issues.

We will be able to talk all this over again during my visit and I much look forward to taking the discussion further then.

THE DRAFT ASSUMES THAT WE WOULD NOT PROVIDE BILATERAL ASSISTANCE EXCEPT FOR DEBT RELIEF IN APPROPRIATE CASES. ONE FURTHER THOUGHT: MIGHT IT NOT BE BETTER TO DELAY THE REPLY UNTIL AFTER THE SUMMIT IN ORDER TO TSKE INTO ACCOUNT COMMENTS BY PARTICTPANTS?

BEGINS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR LETTER OF 16 APRIL. IT

WAS MOST HELPFUL TO HAVE THIS DETAILED ACCOUNT OF YOUR THINKING ON MIDDLE EAST ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ISSUES PRIOR TO THE TOKYO SUMMIT. I AM DETERMINED TO DO WHAT I CAN TO PROMOTE FURTHER PROGRESS TOWARDS A POLITICAL SETTLEMENT WHICH WILL ASSURE THE REGION'S TOWARDS A POLITICAL SETTLEMENT WHICH WILL ASSURE THE REGION'S
FUTURE STABILITY, WHILE MAINTAINING ABSOLUTE FIRMNESS IN THE FACE
OF TERRORISM. I AM LOCKING FORWARD GREATLY TO MY OWN VISIT TO
ISRAEL AND THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONTINUE THE IMPORTANT AND
STIMULATING DISCUSSIONS WE HAD IN LONDON, AND SEE WHAT WE CAN DO
TOGETHER TO MAKE FURTHER STEPS TOWARDS PEACE.

I SHARE YOUR ANALYSIS OF THE DANGER THAT THE FALL IN OIL
PRICES (WHICH OF COURSE AFFECTS US ALSO) COULD HAMPER THIS
PROCESS AND CAUSE SOME COUNTRIES OF THE REGION UERIOUS ECONOMIC
DIFFICULTIES. THESE DESERVE SYMPATHY AND UNDERSTANDING. WE
WILL BE READY TO PLAY OUR PART IN THE APPROPRIATE MULTILATERAL
INSTITUTIONS WHEN THE TIME COMES.

I MUST ADD THAT GREATLY AS I RESPECT ITS OBJECTIVES I AM
LESS OPTIMISTIC THAN YOU THAT IT WILL BE PRACTICABLE UNDER
PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES TO SET UP A REGIONAL ECONOMIC PROGRAMME. PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES TO SET UP A REGIONAL ECONOMIC PROGRAMME. AS YOU POINT OUT, THE POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC ISSUES ARE
INEXTRICABLY LINKED AND I HAVE SERIOUS DOUBTS ABOUT THE READINESS
OF THE ARAB GOVERNMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN MULTI-NATIONAL
ARRANGEMENTS: WHICH THEY MIGHT WELL SEE AS PREMATURE IN THE
ABSENCE OF FURTHER MOVES TOWARDS A SETTLEMENT OF THE POLITICAL
ISSUES: BUT OF COURSE I SHALL BE DISCUSSING THIS MATTER WITH PRESIDENT REAGAN AND OTHERS IN TOKYO WE WILL BE ABLE TO TALK ALL THIS OVER AGAIN DURING MY VISIT (AND I MUCH LOOK FORWARD TO TAKING THE DISCUSSION FURTHER THEN. ENDS.

SUBJECT; MIDDLE EAST REGIONAL ECONOMIC PLAN

Your letter of 1 May enclosed a draft acknowledgement from the Prime Minister to Mr. Peres's recent letter proposing the setting up of a Middle East Marshall Plan. The Prime Minister thinks that such a brief reply risks being taken as a brush-off and would want to answer Mr. Peres's letter rather more fully, even though she will be discussing the subject during her visit to Israel. I should be grateful therefore if you could let me have, either in Seoul or in Tokyo, a somewhat more substantial draft reply, commenting in greater detail on Mr. Peres's ideas.

THE PRIME MINISTER THINKS THAT SUCH A BRIEF REPLY RISKS BEING TAKEN AS A BRUSH-OFF AND WOULD WANT TO ANSWER MR. PERES'S LETTER RATHER MORE FULLY, EVEN THOUGH SHE WILL BE DISCUSSING THE SUBJECT DURING HER VISIT TO ISRAEL. I SHOULD BE GRATEFUL THEREFORE IF YOU COULD LET ME HAVE, EITHER IN SEOUL OR IN TOKYO, A SOMEWHAT MORE SUBSTANTIAL DRAFT REPLY, COMMENTING IN GREATER DETAIL ON MR. PERES'S IDEAS.
