

ANGLO-FRENCH SUMMIT: 27 FEBRUARY

WILL REQUEST IF REQUIRED

Thank you for sending me a copy of your letter of 13 February to Alex Allen.

It is the Secretary of State's view that this is not an opportune time for him or Lord Caithness to be formally proposing bilateral discussions with the French Environment Minister, Lalonde. We would expect in the normal way to ask him over for discussions in late May or June on prospects for the French EC Presidency and, if necessary, the G7 Summit. But for the moment the Secretary of State would prefer to see the dust settle over the Rocard initiative before taking this forward in any structured way. Lord Caithness will however be seeing Lalonde on several occasions: at Environment Councils on 2 March, 8 May and 8 June and he will also have the opportunity of informal discussions when Lalonde attends our CFC Conference on 5-7 March.
