ANGLO/FRENCH SUMMIT IN DUNKIRK: 24 JUNE 1991

I visited Dunkirk yesterday to recce ahead of the Anglo/French Summit later this month. The French seemed still to be tinkering with the programme, but it does now appear to have taken firm shape. I attach a draft of what is proposed from which you will see that Mitterrand would like the Prime Minister to arrive at 13.30. This means a shorter bilateral and a slightly later departure time, of 16.45. (This should still allow return to Wellington Barracks by 17.00 BST, but leaves precious little room for slippage.)

The French have also said that they would like the Ministerial meeetings to last only around an hour. Our Ministerial team will now arrive at 12.30 in Dunkirk, for talks up until just before 14.00. They will then leave for the luncheon venue, arriving there some 5 or 10 minutes before the Prime Minister and President Mitterrand.

The room set aside for the lunch is quite small. As a result, our understanding is that only the principals, Ministers, you and HMA Paris, and your opposite numbers, will attend the lunch. Other senior officals and Private Secretaries will lunch separately. It would be helpful, please, if you could confirm this is the case when you next speak to Morrel.

There are plenty of good photo opportunities during the Summit. For the Press Conference, where there will be simultaneous translation for all, the French propose that only the President and Prime Minister sit at the top table. Ministers will be seated below and to the right of them. You may care to have a few moments, after the Plenary ends, to prepare for the Press Conference, and I have reflected this in the programme. You may wish to alert Morrel to this, which might mean that the Press Conference would only last 25 minutes.
