HONORARIUM OF HEALTH AUTHORITY CHAIRMEN

I am sorry you have not had an earlier reply to your letter of 27 September to Norman Fowler. We wanted to await resolution of other NHS pay issues before moving forward with this.


I fully agree with your view that health authority Chairmen should receive in full the new rates arising from the TRSB Report No 22, which have been approved by the Treasury. I therefore propose to implement increases to £9651 (7.6 per cent) from 1 July 1985 and to £10326 (a further 7 per cent) from 1 March 1986. Perhaps your officials could consult with mine about the timing of the issue of the new rates?

As you have pointed out, we will, of course, need to look at the remuneration of health authority Chairmen in the longer term.

I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister, the Secretaries of State for Scotland and Northern Ireland and the Chief Secretary.



PAY OF HEALTH AUTHORITY CHAIRMEN

In April of this year we agreed that the remuneration of health authority Chairmen should be reviewed in the longer term, and our officials are currently working on this issue.

In the meantime, the Treasury has approved increases consequential on TSRB Report No 22 and I am anxious to recognise without delay the considerable additional efforts which Chairmen have made and are continuing to make to introduce general management in Health Boards. I therefore propose to implement the relevant increases (7.6% from 1 July 1985, with a further 7% from 1 March 1986) as soon as possible. I hope that you see no objection to this course of action.
