Your minute of 21 March records my discussion with the Prime Minister that morning about the involvement of Mr David Mellor MP, Parliamentary (not Permanent) Under Secretary of State, Home Office, in the DHSS's dealings with Intermed.

2. You suggested that I should consider whether guidance needed to be given to Departments about the circumstances in which it was, and was not, appropriate for officials outside Private Offices to talk directly to Ministers and Members of Parliament on such sensitive constituency issues. I now understand from the DHSS that the officer who spoke to Mr Mellor on 9 January was the Private Secretary to a DHSS Minister. I have therefore concluded that this particular case does not suggest that fresh guidance is needed on the subject, and, if you agree, I do not propose to issue any.
