- A. MODUK 19F 111200Z APR (OPERATIONAL TASKS OP CORPORATE).
- 1. You are to produce an outline plan covering a specific operation in the South Atlantic as part of OP CORPORATE.
- 2. AIM. The overall aim of HMG in the current situation is to bring about the withdrawal of Argentine Forces from the Falkland Islands and Dependancies and the re-establishment of British administration there as quickly as possible. Military deployment and operations are directed to the support of this aim.
- 3. Military Aim of OP SUTTON. To land a force ashere in the Falkland Islands with a view to repossessing the islands.

- a. Civilian casualties must be kept to a minimum.
