OPERATIONS

- 1. HMS COVENTRY was hit in a bombing raid by three A4s at 1827Z last night and was reported sinking at 1845Z with her consort BROADSWORD picking up survivors. BROADSWORD was also hit by a bomb which passed through her flight deck and out via ships side without detonating. BROADSWORD's initial damage report states her Lynx badly damaged and some flooding from fractured firemain. No casualties reported in BROADSWORD. Both ships were on station approx 10 nm north of Falkland Sound.
- 2. At 1941Z INVINCIBLE reported 2 Super Etendards closing from approx 115nm NE Port Stanley. Exocet launch (2 missiles) was detected. At missile launch aircraft were at approx 28nm from the Battle Group. The Exocets were seen by HERMES and BRILLIANT to strike ATLANTIC CONVEYOR on the STBD quarter. She took fire, lost all power and was reported abandoning ship at 2040Z. 1 Chinook was recovered to HERMES. Other ships assisting to pick up survivors. CONVEYOR was intended to enter the AOA last night with EUROPIC FERRY, escorted by ALACRITY.
- 3. No details of casualties in either incident are yet available.
- 4. During yesterday afternoon 2 Shar and 4 GR3 repeated the attack on Stanley airfield with 1000lb bombs. A further attack is scheduled pm today.
- 5. A possible Pucara was destroyed by COVENTRY Seadart at 1305Z yesterday, and three A4s by COVENTRY Seadart, YARMOUTH Seacat and Rapier between 1530Z and 1600Z.
- 6. Details of actions are summarised in the attached action incident tote.
- 7. Operations ashore are covered in the CGRM landing force sitrep.
- 8. The fires reported in SIR LANCELOT are now out. No further information on ${\bf V}{\rm XBs}$ has been reported.

OWN FORCES

- 9. Battle Group The Battle Group remains approx 80nm East of the Falklands providing land strike, and CAP in support of the AOA and Amphib Group. ARROW is in San Carlos Bay. ALACRITY was scheduled to escort A. CONVEYOR and EUROPIC FERRY into the AOA last night leaving after partial unload tonight.
- 10. Amphibious Group FEARLESS, INTREPID, PLYMOUTH, ARGONAUT, SIR LANCELOT, SIR GALAHAD, SIR GERAINT and SIR TRISTRAM remain in the AOA. STROMNESS, RESOURCE, FORT AUSTIN, TIDEPOOL and SIR BEDIVERE were conveyed out escorted by YARMOUTH last night.
- 11. BRISTOL Group All units are now inside the TEZ according to latest Fleet sitrep, except PENELOPE and MINERVA who should cross the TEZ at 0800Z today, and CARDIFF lagging remainder following an airdrop (see para 22).
- 12. GLASGOW, ANTRIM and STENA SEASPREAD are now outside the TEZ.

OTHER MOVEMENTS

- 13. LEEDS CASTLE is reported en route to Ascension from the TEZ.
- 14. PLUMLEAF has storm damage to her RAS RIGS and is carrying out repairs approx 1000nm NE of TEZ.
- 15. QE2 arrives South Georgia pm 27 May (Thursday)
- 16. Ascension ENGADINE sails South from ASI today. BRITISH AVON with LT CDR ASTIZ is en route UK. BAYLEAF awaiting stores.
- 17. MCMV's Are en route to South Georgia. ETA pm today. Also at SG: ENDURANCE, BLUE ROVER, TYPHOON, IRIS.
- 18. TUGS SALVAGEMEN, IRISHMAN, YORKSHIREMAN on Eastern edge TEZ.
- 19. RFAs OLNA and FORT GRANGE continue progress South.
- 20. <u>Hospital Ships</u> UGANDA and HYDRA, HECLA, and HERALD are on station in their holding area.
- 21. SSN's Continue on patrol or in transit as ordered.
- 22. Long range Nimrod DNCO returned to ASI 0755Z yesterday with Hydraulic System snags. Further sortie took off approx 2200Z last night. The 'local' ASI Nimrod located an unregistered vessel, the 'IDEFAL' west of Ascension. A Phantom will update the vessel today. Another Phantom flew out to ASI from UK today. Hercules airdrop to CARDIFF completed yesterday at 1730Z with a further long range sortie today to MINERVA and PENELOPE after they reach the TEZ.

STUFT

- 23. AVELONA STAR (9784 gvt) Survey in Antwerp as stores support ship. ETA Portsmouth 30 May.
- 24. GA WALKER (18744 gvt) Already TUFT, but now to be used as Auxiliary Tanker from freighting duties.

25. OPDEFs

Significant OPDEFs are listed in the attached list. (ARCONUTStill has a UXB on board from most recent info available from Fleet).

ENEMY FORCES

- 26. 25 DE MAYO still assessed in P Belgrano, as is the S/M SAN LUIS.79.2 and 79.4 (Type 42 DDGs and A69 FFG Groups) are operating just offshore in the same area. 79.3 (ex-USA DDG's) is at sea off Rio Grande; S/M SALTA is thought to be operating offshore, but could have made ground to the North of the TEZ.
- 27. <u>USSR</u> The PRIMORYE AGI has not yet been updated since DUMBARTON CASTLE's sighting at 2325Z on 24th.

OTHER ITEMS

- 28. HMNZS CANTERBURY could be formally under CINCFLEET opcon by 27 May.
- 29. The shortage of Seacat missiles in the Task Force is causing concern. Ships in the AOA are expending up to one third of outfits daily. (317.0 251157Z and CINCFLEET 252022Z).
- 30. CINCFLEET latest casualty tote has been disted (CINCFLEET 19F/W5F 2518332).
- 31. SEA KING AIRCREW IN CHILE and well by Chilean authorities. (PCO 252322Z). Embassy reports that 3 aircrew located alive Repatriation arrangements are in hand.
