After this morning's meeting of OD(SA), the Chief of the Defence Staff gave the members of OD(SA) forewarning of a proposal for special action against an Argentine airbase. The action would be in two phases: an intelligence gathering phase, followed by an offensive action phase. The proposal was still under study; but, if further study confirmed that it was feasible, he could well need to seek Ministerial approval for the intelligence gathering phase while the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary was out of the country.

Ministers noted that they were not being asked at this stage to take any decision, though they were not disposed to see difficulties in the intelligence gathering phase of the plan. There would be an opportunity for further consideration at the meeting of OD(SA) on the morning of Friday 14 May. If a decision on the intelligence gathering phase was not reached at that meeting, it might be possible for Ministers to agree that it could be taken by the Prime Minister and the Secretary of State for Defence over the weekend if necessary.
