FALKLANDS: IRISH MEDIA REACTIONS.

1. THERE IS A WIDE GULF BETWEEN THE MAIN DUBLIN DAILIES' VIEWS ON THE FALKLANDS CRISIS. THE (FIANNA FAIL) IRISH PRESS HAS BACKED THE IRISH GOVERNMENT TO THE HILT: AND GONE FURTHER. ITS DENUNCIATION ON 19 MAY OF BRITISH ''INTRANSIGENCE'' RECALLED EDITORIALS OF THE HUNGER STRIKE PERIOD. THE IRISH TIMES HAS REGARDED SUPPORT FOR THEIR GOVERNMENT AS A DUTY. IN A SERIES OF NOTABLY INCOHERENT EDITORIALS IT HAS GENERALLY URGED BRITAIN TO FIND A PEACEFUL SOLUTION IRRESPECTIVE OF ARGENTINE ATTITUDES. ON 24 MAY IT ARGUED THAT BRITAIN'S FRIENDS WOULD BE REASSURED BY HER ''NOT EXPLOITING TO THE FULL ANY DECISIVE MILITARY ADVANTAGE OVER ARGENTINA WHICH MAY COME HER WAY.''
