2 seadout 1 sea wolf 7DD/FF. 4 Browt.

Bristol Group ETA FI 25 May (when 1300 NM NE of TEZ 22 May) detected Argentine 707 230 NM SW. Cardiff detached and engaged with 2 x Sea Dart when 707 closed to 31 NM. both missiles passed astern.

ETA RV 27 May. Could land 5 Inf Bde at say 30 May

Exeter. Plus AMBUSCADE, ANTELOPE now with CVBG. ANTELOPE on her second day hit by bombs starboard side pm Sunday 23 May. UXB later exploded. A number of fires were caused and attempts being made to bring them under control. 1 dead and 5 wounded. Ship abandoned at anchor in San Carlos Water.

e. 2214301 2 x low fliers escorted 6 x Mirage probably landed W Falklands on re-supply. Return escort appeared 10 mins later.

221615Z 2 x A4 entered anchorages. Attack not pressed home. 1 x A4 ditched load; not intercepted.

Antelope escorted Norland, Stromness into AOA overnight 22/23 May. Camberra continued cross-decking to Resource/Elk who goes in tarylit.

Early on 23 May Argentinian MV Monsunen driven aground in Eagle Passage. Full details not yet known. (Ships / Studled)

Argonaut Lynx attempted Sea Skua att Both missile failed to lock ne stores ship .

Dunnose Bern airstrip attacked with 4 x CBU and 6 x 1000 Retard. Both strips damaged. No aircraft, stores or activity in area.

230930Z. 2 x SHAR returning HERMES bounced 2 x Puma 1 x Bell Shag Cove. 1 Puma crashed evading, others landed and engaged with canon; SHAR from INVINCIBLE attacked latter, all seen to be smoking.

3 main waves attacked Escorts:

(1) 1245Z. 4 x A4. 1 splashed by ANTELOPE Seacat, 1 PWS, 1 probable by Rapier. 4th believed to have hit ANTELOPE mast and may have ditched. At: ejectel, k: led.

(2) 12/12Z. 4 x Mirage. 1 splashed by Broadsword Seawolf, 1 by Antelope/Plymouth 20 mm PWS, 1 possible (weapon not known). Simultaneous raid from South (total numbers not known) engaged by SHAR; 2 x Mirage splashed.

116Z. 2 x Mirage. 1 splashed by SHAR. 1 jettisoned load. Neither came within 20 nm

O. Argonaut still at anchor making good progress on repairs (1 boiler and 1 engine serviceable with limitations).

b. Submarines.

- (1) Sportan. No contacts other than 1 M/V heading North.
- (2) Splendid. No contacts. Loooking for Bouchard off Rio Grande.
- (3) Conqueror. No contacts
- (4) <u>Valiant</u>. Radar detection to South possibly Seaspray radar.
- (5) Onw. Should have RVL with Bristol Gp 231030Z.
 (6) Courageous. ETA 35°S 280900Z

c. Air.

- (1) <u>Harrier GR3</u>. Recce Weddell Island (West of W FI) 22 May saw unprepared airstrip 2000 ft long N of settlement. No aircraft and area deserted.
- (2) <u>LR Nimrod</u>. Refuelling probe broke during first transfer; re-tasked 400 NM Ascension. Located Primorye AGI and Argentine container ship Atilto Malvagni.

8. Special Forces Operations.

- a. Recce patrols remain on West Falkland and in area of Goose Green and West of Stanley.
- b. D Sqn 22 SAS intend setting up a squadron base West of Stanley within next 48 hours.
- c. B Sqn 22 SAS are in Ascension and will be brought to 1 hour's notice to move from 241440 for re-tasking.
- d. SAS destroyed 1 Pucara using Stinger in the Goose Green aid on 21 May.

9. CTF's Intentions.

- a. Broadsword, Yarmouth, Fort Austin, Sir Tristram to sail last light 23 May to RV Resource/Tidepool and return to AOA before first light (except Sir Tristram).
- b. Elk to AOA night 24/25 May.
- c. Ships to be convoyed out when offloaded.
- d. Airfield denial operations planned on West Falkland. Intention to recce airfields at Dunnose Head, Chartres and Fox Bay with view to Rifle Coy raids.
- e. Continue consolidate beachhead, incl selected logistic offload. Patrol vigorously. Continue planning for Cdo/Bn raid on Darwin/Goose Green.
- f. Nimrod surface surveillance 400 NM Ascension. LR Nimrod overnight 24/25 May.
- g. 2 x AD Phantoms + Victor AAR depart UK 240700Z direct to Ascension.
- h. Roulement plan for DD/FF and SSN to UK plus CVS outside TEZ for rest.
