 - e. What prospects are there for UN peacekeeping, administration, guarantees, etc?
 - f. What damage will be done to the Western/Latin American, US/Latin American, East/West relationship? What will be necessary to repair this?
 - g. How long should we plan on keeping a military presence on and around the Falklands and South Georgia?
 - h. What effects will this have on British defence policy, and on NATO? Will there be more money for Defence?
