Dear Prime Minister,

I write regarding the Comtanks proposal to shut down the Wrexham di-cell acetate yarn manufacturing plant.

If the proposal is carried out it would mean a substantial increase in production in the two remaining Comtanks plants in England and I hope you will use your influence to make Comtanks reconsider their decision. This is not about rescuing "lame ducks" but about the geographical location of a necessary manufacturing capacity. I would be very grateful if I could have a word with you about this at your convenience next week. Comtanks tell me that they will consider seriously any proposal put forward to keep production at Wrexham.
