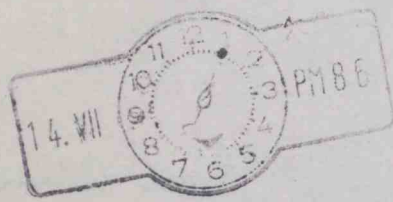
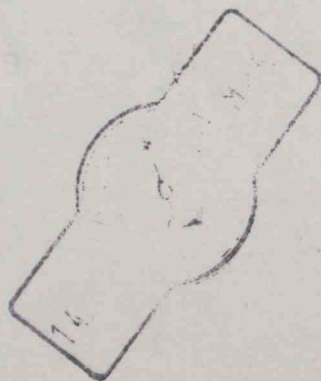
1. After the Japanese Prime Minister's Reception on the evening of Sunday 4 May there will be a photo taken of Heads of Delegation only in the New Otani Garden.
