RECALL OF THE HOUSE APRIL 1982

WEDNESDAY 14TH APRIL 1982

The House rose for the Easter Adjournment on Thursday 8th April until Monday 19th April 1982.

On Sunday 11th April it was decided that the House should meet following talks between the Prime Minister and the United States Secretary of State on the Falkland Islands situation.

The Speaker could not be reached to give his agreement until late on Sunday evening and it was therefore decided to wait until the conclusion of talks at No.10 being held on Monday 12th April before issuing any Recall Notice.

Talks went on longer than expected and in the event about 5.30 pm the No.10 Press Office announced that the House would be recalled to meet on Wednesday 14th April 1982 at 2.30 pm to hear a report on the Government's talks with the United States Secretary of State, and to sit until 7.30 pm.

The debate on the FALKLAND ISLANDS arose on a Motion for the Adjournment of the House.

At the commencement of Public Business a Motion was moved That at its rising today the House do adjourn until Monday 19th April and that at that day's sitting the Speaker do adjourn the House at half past Seven o'clock, without putting any Question.
