Dear Charles,

Thank you for your faxed message of 24 October which reached me in Huntsville, Alabama. I do feel that if ever you have the chance of visiting the US Space Programme facilities there, you should seize it.

I have worked on the speech, and enclose a revised version. Most of it has needed retyping. I have underlined the additional passages for ease of identification.

I make some additional points:

- Pages 10, 11 and 15.

As you will see I have slightly reordered the point I made to the Prime Minister about payment of an insurance premium. This was partly to remove repetition and achieve better internal consistency.

- Page 13

No doubt you have checked these figures. If not you need to do so. You may be interested in some other ones which show per capita emissions of carbon or its equivalent from all sources into the atmosphere in 1987:

China	0.4 tonnes
Japan	1.9 tonnes
Britain	2.6 tonnes
Soviet Union	2.7 tonnes
West Germany	2.8 tonnes
Brazil	3.3 tonnes
United States	4.1 tonnes

This brings out clearly the need for both the industrial countries and the forest-burners to take the lead in stabilizing and then reducing carbon emissions into the atmosphere.



