The Prime Minister has seen the personal letter from the Foreign Secretary about the message which he proposes to give Chancellor Kohl. She is content with what he proposes to say, but would like him also to underline the importance of agreeing the main steps on the way to unification with Britain and the United States, France and the Soviet Union. She would also like the Foreign Secretary to emphasise the crucial importance of Germany remaining in NATO: she thinks Chancellor Kohl's robust stand on this is absolutely right.

do whatever you can to help, and
that he shd. let you know at any
time about this. Is this about
right, and is there anything
you wd. like me to add?
